Another wild beach activity for you to try...

Nature Wristbands or Crowns



Give each child a strip of card big enough for their wrist or head if making a crown. The card strip needs to have double sided tape attached to it which needs to be done prior to the trip. Children then explore the beach finding items they can add to their wristband or crown such as small pebbles, shells, seaweed, rubbish, leaves, twigs, parts of crabs etc.

Attach the wristband/crown to the child so they can wear it on the beach.

Have a beach parade.
